



BREAKFAST CLUB & WRAPAROUND CARE (WAC) FOR SEAGRY CoFE PRIMARY SCHOOL

SESSION TIMES

BREAKFAST CLUB	WAC
Arrive at pre-booked time from 7.30am.	3.10 – 4.15pm or 3.10 – 5.30pm

BUBBLES

- To minimise the risk of the spread of Covid-19, we have been asked to ensure that we reduce the number of contacts between children and staff. This is to be achieved through keeping groups separate in bubbles and maintaining distance between individuals in the school hall. Children at Breakfast Club and WAC will remain the same bubbles as they are during the school day.
- As numbers need to be restricted, WAC will consist only of Seagry children and they will remain in their separate bubbles.

DROP OFF/PICK UP TIMES

- Please arrive as close to the drop off/pick up times as possible.
- During the building works, the entrance/exit for Breakfast Club and WAC will be via the rear hall door. Access is gained via the pupil gate adjacent to the recreation ground.
- Parents are not to enter the school building with their child and must wait outside whilst their child is signed in/out.
- If you arrive at the same time as another parent, please observe the normal social distancing rules.
- We would request that only one adult drops off/collects your child.
- Please ensure that you are prompt at collection time.

HALL AREA

The hall will be divided into bubble sections and we will implement the safety measures set out by the DfE:

- Clear signage displayed reminding children about social distancing between bubbles.
- Each bubble will stay together with their allocated adults and will not mix with other children in other bubbles throughout the session.
- Any shared equipment/resources will be sanitised before re-use.
- Where shared resources, such as books, cannot be sanitised, they will be quarantined for 72 hours.
- Resources/artwork will not be sent home.
- No toys or additional personal belongings should be brought into the club other than the items required for the school day.
- Fire doors and windows will be open whenever possible to allow free flow of air to circulate.

CORRIDORS

- Movement in corridors will be restricted and there will only be one bubble using the corridor at a time.
- High touch points will regularly be cleaned.

HYGIENE & HANDWASHING

- Staff and children will wash hands when they enter the school building.
- Staff and children will continue to wash hands regularly throughout the session with staff supervising the youngest children.
- There will be a plentiful supply of soap, tissues and hand towels.
- There will be a closed lid pedal bin to be used for tissues and hand towels.
- Clear posters promoting hand hygiene will be displayed and regularly referred to.

TOILETS

- There will be toilets allocated for each bubble.
- Only one child to be in the toilets at a time.
- An adult will accompany the youngest children to the toilet.
- Children will wash their hands thoroughly after going to the toilet, the youngest children being supervised by an adult.

CLEANING

- Cleaners will be in attendance daily and ensuring that the products they use are in line with cleaning guidelines
- Particular attention will be paid to high touch areas.
- A deeper clean will be performed on Friday afternoons or over the weekend.
- Staff will use anti-bacterial sprays regularly throughout the session to clean high touch areas.

PPE

The DfE guidance has stated that PPE during normal activities throughout the day is not required.

- PPE will be worn by staff (visor, face mask and gloves) if a child is showing Covid-19 symptoms and they are within 2 metres of the child.
- Appropriate PPE will be worn by staff when carrying out routine cleaning throughout the day.

CLOTHES/UNIFORM/KIT

- Normal school uniform should be worn.
- Uniforms do not need to be cleaned any more often than usual, nor do they need to be cleaned using methods which are different from normal.
- The only items that children should bring into school are their lunchbox, water bottle, sun hat and a waterproof coat. No book bags or rucksacks are required.

SOCIAL DISTANCING

- The DfE guidance acknowledges that in a primary setting it is not always possible to keep to the 1m+ (2m where possible) rule regarding social distancing but should be practised wherever possible (this is one of the reasons why we are being instructed to work in isolated bubbles).
- Staff will regularly remind children about the need for social distancing.
- Floor markers will be placed if necessary, as visual reminder.
- Staff will consistently demonstrate social distancing.

CHILDREN FALLING ILL DURING SESSION

- We will have a more than adequate supply of trained first aiders on duty. However, if your child needs first aid this may be one of the occasions when they will come into contact with a different adult.
- Children who fall ill with Coronavirus symptoms will be taken to an isolation point where they will be observed until you are able to collect them. The usual rules would then apply of 10 days' isolation for them and 14 days for the rest of the family.
- It will be recommended that children in this position will be recommended to be tested for Coronavirus through the normal NHS channels. If the test is positive, then every other child in their bubble and the adults working with them will also have to enter 14 days of isolation. Should they develop symptoms then their families will also have to enter isolation.
- The same rules would apply to an adult who has been working with your child's bubble: if they test positive, then all members of the group will have to follow isolation guidance.
- There will active engagement with NHS Test and Trace system.
